## Comfy corner creations

#### Peppermint Oreo Cookie Cake Balls

1 package of Oreo Cookies or 40 Oreos--finely crushed

1 8 oz. package of cream cheese

2 semi-sweet chocolate bars-melted (I use white and milk

chocolate chips from Wittich's)

Crushed candy canes

Crush the Oreo cookies in a Ziploc bag. Reserve 3 tablespoon to sprinkle on the cake balls. Mix the cookie crumbs and cream cheese. Shape into 1-inch balls. Freeze 10 minutes. Dip balls

in melted chocolate and place on cookie sheet lined with parchment paper or wax paper. Use toothpicks for easy dipping. Sprinkle with crushed candy canes and cookie crumbs. Refrigerate 1 hour.

of 2017, Chris was expecting their 3rd child and resigned her position as Director of Children's Ministry. I was then asked to take over the program."



## BREEZE coming soon...

BREEZE, a user-friendly software management tool, will be an addition to Circleville First Church. Databases will be created for the church as a whole and for various church ministries, making it easier to perform a variety of tasks.

The program will originate in the church office. It will take a few weeks to implement the BREEZE program. Once the program is in place, up and running, it can be used for church wide emails and texts as well as individual ministries; this is basic capabilities. It has the ability to keep financial records, print labels plus so much more.

General information from you will be needed to begin this process: name, address, phone/cell number, birthday and email address. This user-friendly software will not be implemented until the first of the new year.




