Kitchen delights

This recipe is from my daughter-in-law, **Sarah Johnson** and it's **Annie's** favorite soup.

Taco Soup

1.5 lb. ground turkey or ground beef, browned

1 can corn, undrained

1 pkg. taco seasoning

1 can diced tomatoes, undrained

1 tsp. chili powder

1 (8 oz.) can tomato sauce

1 tsp. cumin



1 onion, diced

1 can red beans, drained & rinsed

1 bell pepper (any color), diced

1 can black beans, drained & rinsed

Brown ground turkey/beef with diced onions. Then, add taco seasoning, chili powder and cumin. Cook according to taco seasoning instructions.

If cooking on stove top: add remaining ingredients and cook on med-high heat for 20--30 minutes.

If using crock pot: add ground turkey/beef mixture to crock pot. Add remaining ingredients and cook on low for 6-8 hours. Ground turkey/beef mixture can also be made in advance and frozen, then added to crock pot with remaining ingredients.

Serve with toppings of choice: diced avocado, tortilla chips, shredded cheese, sour cream, black olives, green onions, cilantro, etc.

If cooking for a large crowd: increase to 2 diced bell peppers, 16 oz. can tomato sauce, 2 cans corn and add one additional can drained/rinsed beans of choice (e.g. pinto). Adjust taco seasoning to taste.



Tears of Joy

Weeks ago, I did an ultrasound on a client who miscarried last year and was anxious to see how this pregnancy was developing. During her scan, we saw a gestational sac—which is where the baby would be—but there were no signs of a baby yet. Sometimes it is simply too early to see the secondary yolk sac, which nourishes the baby until the placenta takes over and too early to see the fetal pole. I measured the gestational sac and tried to reassure her that everything looked as we would expect for an early pregnancy. I explained that if we repeated the ultrasound in a couple of weeks, we would likely see more. She scheduled the follow-up appointment and then faced the hardest part: waiting.

The day finally arrived for her ultrasound. She brought her mom and the baby's father for support. She was so very nervous as she climbed onto the table, admitting that she could feel her heart racing. They all wanted this baby so much. I quickly swept the transducer across her lower belly and, almost instantly, we saw what we had been hoping for. I zoomed in and pointed out her tiny baby, exactly where the baby should be, with the unmistakable flicker of a heartbeat in the center of its chest. Tears spilled down my client's face, then her mom's, then the father's—and soon my own eyes were teary, too. Tissues were passed around the room, followed by phones being pulled from pockets to capture videos as the sound of that strong little heartbeat filled the room. We laughed through our tears, overwhelmed by joy and relief that this pregnancy looked healthy.

I printed her pictures and she proudly signed up for the Mom's Program to begin earning baby items. As they left, she smiled through happy tears of joy and whispered, "This finally feels real."

In August, I was part of a work team through Samaritan's Purse to Burnsville, North Carolina. This was not my first

work team, but it was one I was blessed with and prepared for through multiple previous life-long lessons and experiences.

All I knew about Samaritan's Purse was their Christmas Shoe Box Ministry, however that is only a very small part of their ministry. I had no idea the vast expanse it has around the world through multiple ways of touching lives. In September 2024 the mountains of North Carolina experienced flooding when the aftermath of the hurricane went through. Many, many lost their homes, lives, livelihoods from the flooding that hit. Rivers, streams, creeks rose some 40 feet. The devastation left destruction that will take years to recover and rebuild.

Twenty volunteers met the week I was there and we were divided into 5 or 6 teams which went to multiple villages, towns and worked on homes. Some of these homes were totaled and needed to be rebuilt from ground up and Samaritan's Purse comes with their "orange shirt brigade" and does what they do best...be the hands and feet of Jesus. The volunteers were made up of just ordinary people that were willing to help, we served with an 80-year-old lady that loved working with gardens, plants, soil etc. and that is just what she did. She made sure that the new home she worked with had beautiful landscaping and perfect plants to remind them daily of SP and the love Jesus has for them.

I worked in a home directly across from one of the rivers that overflowed in the town of Spruce Pine. It did not destroy the outside of the home, because it was built of river rock, but the inside took a beating. By the time we left she had new windows, flooring, paint, total new kitchen, utility room, bathroom and more. New furniture and a deck came after we left. It was a blessing to be able to return this family home, of over 100 years, back to be enjoyed for many years to come.

As for me, I painted, used my drywall mudding experience, along with sanding, filling in holes, replacing soffits and did some overall cleaning and removing of mud. Plus, anything else that needed to be taken of. The total cost for me to go, was \$30 to help out with gas for the trip and my meals down and back. Samaritan's Purse took care of everything else, I mean everything. They put us up, made sure we had plenty to eat, all supplies were provided along with ministry material, to witness to those we helped out. Their main concern was that we would be the hands and feet of Jesus and help those through their loss through sharing Jesus' love.

I would challenge you to think about when you could go and spend a week serving (ages 14 and up are welcome to serve). I

guarantee you will be blessed. I will be going again - soon.
