Maybe it's helping serve lunch which will be needed on daily basis, maybe it's coming to chapel and worshiping and being apart.

I would like to see Growth groups who take classes and pray for them by name each week and take opportunities to let the students know you are caring. Maybe it's by sponsoring a student so they can go to Creation Museum and learn more of God's design for them. I would love to have men and women who go down and pray through the hall and lockers each day for the students before the day begins asking for His touch on their lives spiritually.

What I don't want to hear is talk about CCA ministry and negative talk about the kids or their involvement at our church. If you have concern, speak to me or a board member, but never negative to the students. They have enough against them we won't be another negative voice.

There will be some logistics that will need to change for us to have this ministry in our building.

- One, you will no longer Mon-Fri be able to just come in the back double doors whether you have key or not, EVERYONE will come to the front double doors during the week. This is for safety of all.
- Second, you will need to park on the street when you come or by the fellowship hall if it's during drop off and pick up times.

I am excited for us to invest in the next generation this way and look forward to many exciting updates together.

Tough Decisions

Recently I've had a couple of clients who have come in for an ultrasound but ultimately, they were seeking to end their pregnancies. They were talking about ordering the abortion pill online. They were feeling scared and trapped and like they had no other choice. The pills come in a package in the mail containing a small bottle, a few pills and simple instructions, but there is no doctor, no ultrasound and no one involved to talk about what will be the silent death of a preborn baby.

That's where Elizabeth's Hope comes into the picture. We slow things down. We take the time to listen to her and help her start to see beyond her immediate crisis to look toward the future potential. We let her know she is not alone. We let her know she is stronger than she thinks she is and that she can do this. We give her a free ultrasound and allow her to see her baby within her, pointing out the small features of head, face, chest, bottom and of course heartbeat. And sometimes, that moment—seeing the flicker of a heartbeat, hearing someone say "you're not alone"—is enough to shift everything. She may still be scared. The road ahead may still be hard. But now, she has hope. Elizabeth's Hope doesn't make the decision for her. We simply offer her the space to breathe, to reflect and to rediscover her strength. We believe every woman deserves to know that her life—and the life within her—matters.

Please pray along with us as we counsel our clients as they are navigating through tough decisions.

Kitchen delights

I found the following recipe in a book I have from the Depression Era.

Water Pie

Ingredients:

- 1 (9-inch) deep-dish pie crust, unbaked
- 1 1/2 cups water
- 4 tablespoons all-purpose flour
- 1 cup sugar
- 2 teaspoons vanilla extract
- 5 tablespoons butter, cut into 5 pieces whipped cream, to taste, for serving

Directions:

- Step 1 Preheat the oven to 400 degrees F.
- Step 2 -Set the empty pie crust on a baking sheet.
- Step 3 -Pour the water into the pie crust.
- Step 4 -In a small bowl, stir the flour and the sugar together.
- Step 5 -Evenly sprinkle the sugar mixture over the water in the crust. Do not stir.
- Step 6 -Drizzle the vanilla over the water and top with the pieces of butter.
- Step 7 -Bake the pie for 30 minutes.
- Step 8 -Lower the heat to 375 degrees F and carefully cover the sides of the crust with foil, if needed, to prevent burning.
- Step 9 -Cook the pie for 30 minutes, then allow it to completely cool. The pie will be watery when you take it out of the oven, but it will gel as it cools.
- Step 10 -Cover the pie and chill in the fridge until ready to serve.
- Step 11 -Slice and serve with the whipped cream
